The question is, given the mutual anger and distrust, how can this be achieved?"

So, may those of us who wish for life and plenty for both Palestinians and Israelis commit ourselves to prayer. May we pray especially that world leaders and diplomats with the vision, wisdom, care and perhaps most of all the courage, will find profound and creative ways to help lead Palestinians and Israelis to a final, just and lasting peace in the land so many call holy."
