we'll eternally keep.

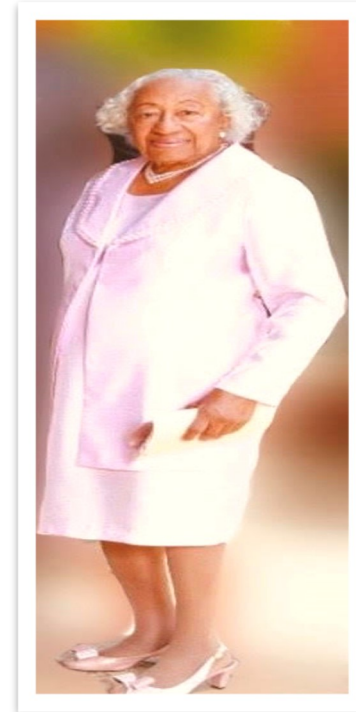
