Jacqueline Ann Peters Tolbert, affectionately called “Jackie,” was born on March 14, 1939 to the late Helen Graham Peters and the late Thornton Peters in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

She attended the public schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and was a member of the 1957 graduating class of Atkins High School. Following high school graduation she was briefly enrolled at Fisk University. She later moved to Altadena, California in 1958 where she remained for 48 years. While there, she was employed as a shipping/receiving lead for twenty-one years at Malco Electronics and did part-time work for the IRS for six years.

Jackie began her early Christian education at Mount Zion Baptist Church in Winston-Salem where she joined and was baptized under the pastorate of the late Reverend Dr. Kelly O. P. Goodwin. Following her residency in California, she returned to the city, restored her membership and faithfully attended Mount Zion Baptist Church until her recent passing.

Young Jacqueline was introduced to society as debutante at age 16. From that time until the very end, she was the consummate host of parties that ranged in size, were expensive, formal, and rivaled the production and planning of most weddings — complete with invitations, programs, seating arrangements, menus, open bars, flowers, musical entertainment and more. She was the “queen of our hearts” who loved to entertain and she was always the perfect lady.

Jacqueline Ann Peters Tolbert exchanged worlds and went home to live with the Lord from Forsyth Memorial Hospital in Winston-Salem on Saturday, June 6, 2020 following a period of illness. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her son Gary M. Tolbert and his father, Wilbert; and her brothers, Phelon and Orlando Peters.
