She graduated from Atkins High School and began work in the tobacco industry. She ultimately retired from Export Leaf Tobacco where she developed the process used to "**tie**" tobacco squares. Besides providing support to her family, she enjoyed crafts and creating dolls.

Ms. Ledbetter loved St. John CME Church where she was a member of the Missionary Society, Gospel Choir and Russell Bible Class. For more than thirty years, she actively served as an usher and stewardess. When she could no longer actively serve, she received emeritus status.
