Ms. Lena Catherine Brown, 100, was born to the late Sink and Pearl Sprinkle Brown in Davie County, North Carolina on March 2, 1917.

She lived a part of her early life in Charlotte, North Carolina with her sister, Flora. She then moved to New York City where she resided and worked for thirty-eight years. While there, she attended the United Palace House of Inspiration in Harlem.

In 2001, Lena returned to North Carolina so that she could be near her only living sister, Eva and her family. Until she reached the age of 100, Lena lived independently and cared for herself at HAWS Healy Towers in Winston-Salem. Declining health made it necessary for her to move to Oak Forest Health and Rehabilitation Facility for assisted living.

She was fond of all of her family members, but especially her sister, Eva. The sisters constantly spoke with one another by telephone. Lena's favorite color was red, she liked delicious desserts, getting her hair braided and listening to positive affirmations on her stylish appearance.

Lena Catherine Brown passed away at Forsyth Medical Center in Winston-Salem, North Carolina on Thursday, June 15, 2017. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by four brothers, Charlie, Sam, Joe and Clifton Brown; and two sisters, Beulah Imes and Flora Miller.
