

## **OBITUARY**

"I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith" II Timothy 4:7

Joseph Lee Johnson was born in Winston-Salem, North Carolina to the late Edward Johnson and Alice Mackey Johnson on August 13, 1940.

He attended the public schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and graduated from Atkins High School.

Joe was a machine operator for R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company and retired following thirty-seven years of dedicated service to the company.

He was a professional player on the Black Golf Tour before Blacks were allowed to play on the PGA Tour (founded in 1929, the organizer of the main professional golf tours played primarily by men in the United States and North America).

"A Living Legend, Joe Johnson is the first African American to play and win the Forsyth Invitational Golf Tournament (1966)." He also coached for the Earnest Morris Junior Golf Program at Winston Lake Golf Course in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Mr. Joseph Lee Johnson entered his eternal rest to be with Our Father in Heaven at Forsyth Medical Center in Winston-Salem on Saturday, July 15, 2017, following a period of illness. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Hazel Johnson; two brothers, Edward and Robert Johnson; a great granddaughter, Dashia; and a brother-in-law, Bobbie Joins.

Those family members who survive and who will forever cherish loving memories of him include Carolyn M. Jones, his devoted wife of forty-six years; two daughters, Victoria K. Johnson of Charlotte and Vernita K. Johnson of the city; his step children, Dewanna Conrad and Willie B. (Jackie) Conrad, Jr.; two sisters, Ann Joins and Bessie Gray; a brother, Narvell (Plusha) Johnson; fourteen loving grandchildren; eleven great grandchildren; two sisters-in-law, Gretchen Moore and Ella Robinson; a brother-in-law, Reverend Edward L.
