She attended the public schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and graduated from Carver Consolidated High School in 1965. Following graduation, she enrolled at McLean Business School where she completed the required coursework and earned an associate degree in business.

Ruth was employed as an engineering technician at Western Electric Company for over twenty-one years. She then became the Manager of TJ Maxx Department Store. Ruth retired as a full-time manager in 2011 but remained with the company as a part-time employee until her unexpected death.

She was a life-long member of Mount Zion Baptist Church. For a period during her Christian walk, which spanned more than sixty years, she found joy and purpose as a teacher in the Sunday Church School and was a member of the Inspirational Choir.

Ruth had a significant company of friends and acquaintances. Many were fellow members of the Carver High School Alumni Association and her neighbors in The Salem Village Community. She was a faithful long-time volunteer for the biennial National Black Theatre Festival.
