OBITUARY

Mrs. Eva Brown Hairston, 98, was born to the late Saint Brown and Pearl Sprinkle Brown in Clemmons, North Carolina on April 13, 1919. She was educated in the schools of Davie County.

Eva Brown was married to Paul Alexander Hairston on May 2, 1934. Paul and Eva moved to the Piney Grove Community in the 1930's and their marriage was blessed with the birth of five daughters, Clara, Jacqueline, Mary, Linda and Debra. The couple had been married for 52 years at the time of Paul's death on September 22, 1986.

Mrs. Hairston joined Piney Grove Baptist Church in 1948 and maintained that membership for the remainder of her life. She was a charter member of the church's Senior Usher Board and she faithfully served in that ministry for over fifty years. She retired from active participation in 2005. Eva was an inspector at R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. She was a dedicated employee for forty-six years prior to her retirement from the company.
