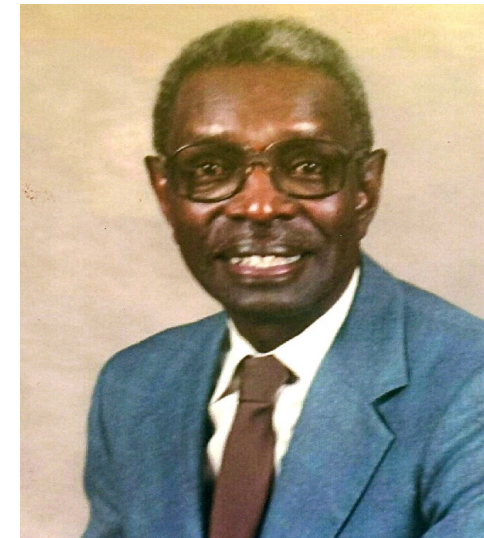

# The Obituary

Brother Eugene Henry Caldwell was born on October 17, 1923 to the late Pearl and George Caldwell. He was the oldest of nine children. He graduated from Atkins High School. In 1943, Brother Caldwell joined the military and served in the United States Army during World War II. He was honorably discharged in 1946.

Following Brother Caldwell’s discharge from the military, he was employed by McLean Trucking Company for 46 years as one of the oldest African American workers on the loading dock. He retired from this well-known company. During this time he also joined Emmanuel Baptist Church where he was baptized. In 1952 he joined Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church. He became an active member and served faithfully for 66 years until his health declined. In May 1982, he was ordained as a Deacon and served on the Board as the most senior of all its members. Brother Caldwell dutifully attended Sunday School (Senior Men’s Class) and noon day Bible Study. He was past secretary of the Deacon Ministry, Deacon Emeritus and Emeritus member of the Senior Choir and Male Chorus. He was a member of the Golden Age Senior Citizens Ministry and willingly served as chaplain for more than seven years.

Brother Caldwell enjoyed planting his vegetable garden yearly and was well known for growing the best okra. An avid sports fan, he enjoyed watching all sports. His favorite NFL Team was the Washington Redskins. His college team was the UNC-Tar Heels. He would watch golf on the television all day.

Deacon Caldwell departed this earthly life on August 24, 2018. In addition to his parents, his five brothers preceded him in death; Haywood, Nathaniel, Raeford, George Jr., and Leon; two sisters: Maggie C. Green and Beatrice C. Rorie; nephew, Anthony K. Green; nieces, Dorethea A. Green and Suzie Felder.

He leaves to cherish their priceless and loving memories: two daughters: Linda Caldwell Peter of Houston, Texas, Cathy Caldwell of Boston, Massachusetts; and one son, Eugene D.
