The Broken Chain

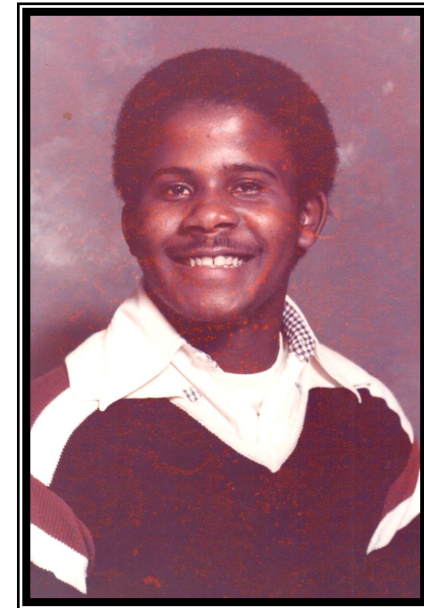
We knew that night
