Some weakness I have strengthened.

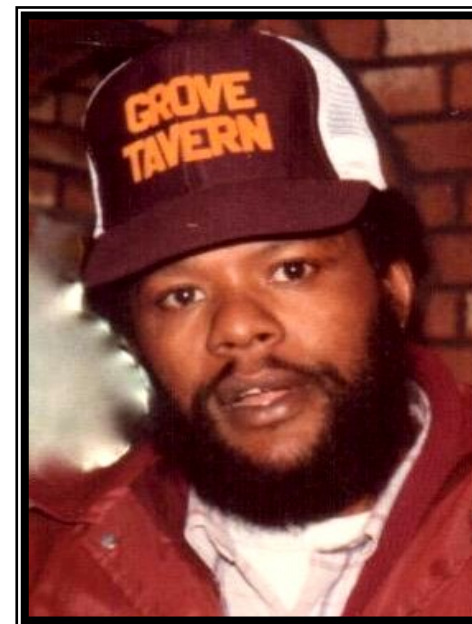
I want to know, that come what may,
