Josiah Bouricius and his guest,
Toltec elder Ezequiel Garcia

We will have another intriguing evening at the Center on **Wednesday April 25 at 7 pm featuring Josiah Bouricius and his guest, Toltec elder Ezequiel Garcia**. They will be exploring the topic of "worldview perspectives," comparing and contrasting the Western and indigenous ways of knowing about and describing reality. They will use examples from each of their lives to show how their unique experiences shaped their worldviews.

Josiah Bouricius is a former Mindshift intern who was raised in an atheist family but later embraced spirituality. His worldview shift included travelling to and researching the many ancient sacred sites in New England, which have largely been ignored or dismissed by mainstream archaeologists. It was during his exploration of these sites that he first met his co-speaker.

Ezequiel Garcia is an elder in the Toltec spiritual tradition whose training began as a young child under the guidance of his adoptive grandfather. He has travelled widely throughout the indigenous world, participating in numerous traditional ceremonies such as the sweat lodge, vision quest and sun dance. He created a film of his recent travel to Ecuador. Short sections of the film will be shown to help explain the purpose behind his journey and what he brought back.
