

We can follow the example of Paul. First, make surety of your call. Ask God what must you do to minister to others, in a way that pleases Him, especially during this season. Jesus gave us basic instructions when He said that we should let our light shine, by doing good works, so that others may see them, and glorify God (Mathew 5:17). Our lights shine when the world sees love, kindness, patience, peace, faith, self control, and humbleness. Even when you do not have material to give, you can reflect the fruit of the Spirit. Treat others as you want to be treated. Pray for others as you pray for yourself and your loved ones.

As we approach Thanksgiving, let us rejoice in the fact that God gave us His Son, Jesus Christ to save us from hell: eternal death and damnation. Then let the world see Jesus in you as a pattern and example, of joy, peace and love, because of eternal life through faith in Jesus Christ!
