Have you noticed an increase in cataract ads

advice: A cataract is a cloudiness which occurs in the natural lens of the eye. Most often this occurs due to the natural aging process.

The cataract surgery process is simple, quick and option filled. The natural lens of the eye is removed and replaced with a small permanent implant. There are options for the implant at many price ranges. Traditional lens replacement often allows for near or distance vision only. Persons choosing this often wear reading glasses after surgery. New advanced technology options include multifocal lens implants which are like having a permanent bifocal lens. The brain adapts to the lens to allow near and distance vision. There is also a new premium lens option which improves vision by correcting for astigmatism. Finally, there is a new device which creates a laser guided incision at the beginning of the cataract surgery procedure.

All of these options cause a need for public awareness, the primary reason for the recent increase in cataract surgery advertising. The doctors of The Eye Care Institute offer all of these cataract surgery options.
