He retired from the US Air Force in 1996 after 24 years of outstanding service. He held three career fields Security Police Specialist, Structural Repair Specialist and Occupational Safety and Health Manager, a position that he presently holds at **Robins Air Force Base**, Georgia. In 2000 he was ordained at **New Hope Baptist Church** Perry, Georgia. Where Reverend Dennis Harden is currently pastor.
