Matthew 6:5 "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth."

The Beatitudes describe the character of those who truly belong to the Kingdom of God. Jesus is teaching about the qualities of a person who has been transformed by the Gospel. In this article, we will consider the third beatitude "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth."

In our world, it appears that those who are aggressive, demanding, and domineering get ahead and reap the benefits. Throughout history, the threat of tyrannical governments is always real; governments who impose their rule over their own population and neighboring countries. Sadly, one of the consequences of this sin-torn world is that people use their own influence, wealth, and authority to take advantage of the poor and vulnerable, rather than helping them. But there is good news, God resists the proud and gives favor to the humble. God will hold those who harm others accountable in eternity and the meek will inherit the earth.

Meekness is gentle humility. This is not a weakness. In fact, the same term "meek" is used in Matthew 11:29 to describe Jesus where he encourages us to find rest in Him, knowing that He is gentle. Yet, Jesus was not weak. Our gentle Lord boldly confronted the hypocrisy of the Jewish leadership and then courageously endured the suffering of the cross for our salvation.

Far from being a weakness, meekness is a strength, not in terms of physical strength. Meekness is a strength in terms of mental fortitude and toughness. Someone who is meek/humble/gentle is strong because they are not influenced and controlled by unrealistic expectations, deceptive tactics and by the constant desire to gain the approval of others. The meek remain content with the Lord Jesus, knowing that He is good and faithful. The meek do not demand their own rights. The meek do not assert their own importance. Instead, the meek continually surrender to the Lord in obedience to His Word. The meek allows their faith in Christ to shape their entire life.

The Lord promises the meek that they will inherit the earth. Ultimately, the earth does not belong to the mighty and powerful, it belongs to the Lord Jesus and he will share it with all his followers. As Christians, we will rule with Jesus in his eternal Kingdom. A blessed and precious promise for every believer to embrace and an encouragement seek the transforming power of the Holy Spirit to help us to live with gentleness, humility and meekness.
