"Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come." 1 Timothy 4:7-8

I have always enjoyed the sense of hope and promise that the New Year brings. The New Year is like a blank canvas for a flesh start, providing the opportunity for improvements in key areas of our lives. People make various resolutions to make positive changes. The most common resolutions are generally directed towards one's physical wellbeing, such as the resolutions to lose weight, exercise frequently and eat healthy. Obviously, these are worthy pursuits to give more time and attention to in the New Year. In fact, in the verses above, Paul acknowledges the value of bodily training. Yet, at the same time, let us not forget about how we can invest greater energy towards our spiritual health in the New Year.

In 1 Timothy 4:7-8, Paul directs Timothy to train himself for godliness. The word "train" can also be translated as "discipline." To train for godliness or to discipline ourselves for godliness means that we must put active and intentional effort to live in godliness. This is a command, not an optional experience of the Christian life. Hebrews 12:14 says that without holiness no one will see the Lord. As Paul notes, while bodily training has some value, putting consistent effort and attention to your training in godliness has greater value. It impacts not only this life, but the life the come.

Sometimes when the personal responsibility of living out the Christian faith is mentioned, there are fears of entering into legalism. It is true that no one can live in godliness by sheer will power. On our own, our hearts do not desire the things of God (see Romans 3). Yet, at the same time, God's grace never allows believers to live in continuous ongoing sin, with no regard to His holy Word. God's grace frees us from the power of sin so that we can live in godliness. Philippians 2:12-13 helpful. Here Paul calls believers to work out their salvation in fear and trembling. That is the believer's responsibility. It is another way of Paul writing "Train yourself for godliness." If someone who claims to be a Christian is not actively working out their salvation or training for godliness, there are good reasons for him or her to question whether they have ever truly believed in the Lord Jesus in a biblical understanding of saving faith. At the same time, in Philippians 2:13, Paul reminds believers that ultimately, it is God who is working in them, both to will and to work for his good pleasure. Thus, the source of power to work out one's salvation and to train for godliness is from God. Even the desire itself to work out one's salvation and to train for godliness is by God's grace.

As we approach the New Year, consider how you have been pursuing holiness and, by God's grace, the ways in which you can pursue greater holiness in 2019. The first place to begin is by committing yourself to grow closer to the Lord by obeying His Word. Read the Bible through in the year in your own personal study, seeking to live it out. Make a fresh commitment to attend faithfully the church services, including Sunday School, Sunday morning worship, Sunday evening worship and Wednesday night Bible Study. Remember, we are not training for godliness alone.

National Sanctity of Human Life Day

National Sanctity of Human Life Day is celebrated on January 20, 2019. National Sanctity of Human Life Day is an observance declared by several U.S. Presidents who opposed abortion. President Ronald Reagan designated January 22, 1984 as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. The date was chosen to coincide with the 11th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court case that first recognized the constitutionally-protected status of abortion in the United States.

Reagan issued the proclamation annually thereafter, designating Sanctity of Human Life Day to be the third Sunday in January, which represents the closest Sunday to the original January 22 date. His successor, George H. W. Bush, continued the annual proclamation throughout his presidency. Bush's successor, Bill Clinton, discontinued the practice throughout his eight years in office, but Bush's son and Clinton's successor, George W. Bush, resumed the proclamation, and did so every year of his presidency.
