Matthew 7:7 "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock and it will be opened to you."

Matthew 7:11 "if you then, who are evil know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!"

In Matthew 7:7, Jesus teaches his followers to "ask, knock, and seek" in prayer. Each command is present, implying continuous action. You could translate it "keep on asking, keep on knocking, and keep on seeking." Jesus is calling us to be persistent in prayer. The implications of Jesus' instructions are stunning. It means that the Heavenly Father is always available. Pastor Timothy Keller writes, "The only person who dares wake up a king at 3:00 AM for a glass of water is a child. We have that kind of access." As a father, I want my children to know that I will always be available for them. Even when I do not grant their requests, whether because it is beyond my control or because I feel it is not in their best interest, I still want them to have the freedom to approach me and to ask me. In a far greater way, the child of God, by faith in the Lord Jesus, can freely go before the Heavenly Father in prayer at any time and under any circumstance.

Another beautiful implication of Jesus' teaching is that the Heavenly Father is a generous provider. In Matthew 7, Jesus is teaching us to be prayer beggars. That is not to say that we should treat prayer like a magic formula where if we say the right words or right amount of words it guarantees a positive answer from God in the manner that we desire. Earlier in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches, "When you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words" (Matt. 6:7). Afterwards, he establishes the model prayer, the Lord's Prayer where he teaches to pray for daily bread, not for worldly wealth. Back in Matthew 7, in the illustration Jesus provides in Matthew 7:9-11 points to how the Heavenly Father provides the basic necessities of life, such as daily food (bread/fish). The "good gifts" that the Heavenly Father gives to those who ask refers to everything that pertains to seeking first the Kingdom of God and its righteousness (Matt. 6:33). The Heavenly Father is so generous that he is willing to give us all that we need to live faithfully before the Lord Jesus.

The proper response to a good and gracious God is to be in continuous prayer. Here at New Hope, I pray that we will be faithful in our prayers for our families, church and community. We know that apart from Christ we can do nothing. Prayerlessness removes us from abiding in Christ.

Jody Watson – Evangelist & Recording Artist Guest Speaker (filling in for Pastor Jason while on vacation) Sunday, July 28, 2019

Jody Watson is an Evangelist, Contemporary Christian Recording Artist. He wrote all the music and lyrics on his debut album, entitled "Thank You God for My Momma", which is based on his life experiences. Jody Watson is a self-taught guitar player and began playing when he was moved to write a tribute song to his mom for all she endured and sacrificed raising and caring for him and his younger brother.

Jody Watson and his brother were raised by a single mother who worked two and three jobs to feed, clothe and keep them together because their father was never around. Jody's mother saw that all attended a small church every Sunday and he became a member of the Children's Choir, which he loved. At age 12, Jody Watson accepted Jesus as his Lord and Savior in that church. The hard work and dedication of his mother and the hardships that his family faced are the inspiration for his title track – "Thank You God for My Momma".

The first instrument Jody Watson learned to play, by ear, was the drums. Jody received a drum set along with a guitar for Christmas at age five. This began his life-long dream of becoming a professional musician. Jody began performing for family and friends at age 12 and by the time he was 15, Watson had written his first song. At age 21, Jody Watson recorded that song and still has the copy of it today.

God has always been a profound influence in Jody's life, but as a young man, he struggled to find his place in the world. He had a big dream, that he felt he could achieve, but was still working to make it a reality when one evening, as he sat on his bed, a bright light engulfed him and a warm sensation came over his body. Jody Watson knew in his heart that God was boldly speaking to him, an experience that changed his life. This event and Divine inspiration from the Holy Spirit given through revelation, prompted him to write "I Thought I Was Alone".

Jody Watson has a special love for the beach and feels it is the closet to heaven he will get in his life. It is there that he can breathe and gets his greater sense of peace.
