2 Corinthians 4:6 "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ."

What is the greatest blessing of the Gospel? Is it forgiveness of sin? Assurance of Heaven? These are precious blessings of the Gospel that we hold close to heart, but the highest good and greatest blessing of the Gospel is the Lord Jesus himself, to know Him and enjoy Him above all else. The goal of the Gospel is not to bail us out from our guilt of sin or to offer a ticket to heaven. There is a greater aim, which is to open our eyes to see the beauty of Jesus. There is nothing more beautiful and nothing greater than knowing the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. Despite all the struggles, frustrations and disappointments of life, we can remain strong, not losing heart, by experiencing God's glory through faith in Jesus.

In spite of all of our differences, every true Christian shares the same testimony as described in 2 Corinthians 4:6. Praise God, just as He spoke light into the darkness of the physical universe at creation, through Jesus' atoning sacrifice on the cross, affirmed in His resurrection from the dead, as an act of a new creation of a redeemed people, God shines His light into our hearts so that we may know His glory.

The knowledge of the glory of God is not a mere intellectual knowledge. It certainly involves believing in Jesus Christ as revealed in God's Holy Word. Sound doctrine is important. Yet, saving faith is more than passing a theology exam. Saving faith also involves experiencing God through faith in the Lord Jesus. Reflecting 2 Corinthians 4, Jonathan Edwards used the illustration of honey. A person can make a rational judgment that honey is sweet because it is widely known that honey is sweet. But this is far different than knowing the honey is sweet by tasting it and having a sense of its sweetness. Edwards points out that there is a difference between having the view that God is holy and gracious and having a sense of the loveliness and beauty of God's holiness and grace. The good news of the Gospel is that we can enjoy the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. We can know personally the sweetness of the Lord Jesus Christ. The invitation of the gospel is the invitation to taste and see that the Lord is good (Psalm 34:8).
