Chapel Location:

The physical address of Moss Creek Chapel is 46043 State Highway 118 in Alpine, Texas. It is about one-mile South of the Alpine city limits or Blue Water Natural Foods.

Purpose:

The Moss Creek Chapel is a multiple-use building intended primarily as a place of worship and Bible study for the Big Bend Bible Fellowship. It is now available as a wedding and event venue through Wind River Photography. Teresa will also use the building as a photography studio.

About Moss Creek Chapel:

The name of the chapel is taken from Moss Creek that runs parallel to State Highway 118 across from the building. The creek was named after Joseph Moss who moved to Alpine in 1906 and was a long-time surveyor of Brewster County. The architecture of the Moss Creek Chapel was inspired by Spanish Missions to honor the historical heritage of Texas.

Inspiration:

Scott & Teresa Huckaby wanted to establish a place in Alpine for non-denominational ministry focusing on relating the Bible to today's uncertain times. Additionally, Teresa wanted a building that could serve as a romantic, affordable wedding venue to give her more opportunities for wedding photography. Teresa especially likes to be part of helping couples remember what is often the most significant day of their lives together.

About Scott & Teresa Huckaby:

Scott and Teresa have lived in Alpine since 2011 but visited the Big Bend region annually during their 32 years of marriage. Scott has led adult Bible studies for 26 years. Teresa was active in wedding and event photography in the Houston area since 1990 and managed a wedding venue there for five of those years.

About Big Bend Bible Fellowship:

Scott began leading Bible studies meeting outside existing churches in 2019 appealing to participants not affiliated with an established church. The group began referring to itself as the Big Bend Bible Fellowship to reflect its vision of attracting participants from the tri-county area hungry for the meatier doctrines of God's Word. The Bible studies are all conducted with essential inerrancy of Scripture in mind. Scott asks a lot of questions during the course of the Bible studies intended to guide self-discovery and stimulate a discussion.

Everyone Welcome at Big Bend Bible Fellowship:

Big Bend Bible Fellowship is intended for mature Christians who hunger for the solid food of God's Word, new Christians who are excited about growing in their faith, and all others who are curious about the deeper things of Christianity. So, effectively everyone is invited to participate in the Big Bend Bible Study discussions regardless of their spiritual background.

Presently at Big Bend Bible Fellowship:

The Big Bend Bible Fellowship meets at the Moss Creek Chapel for Bible study 7-8pm Sunday evenings and is currently discussing the book of Daniel covering about a chapter each session. The Bible study discussions are open to the public and there is no cost to participate.
