

On Friday, November 2, 1973, in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Deloris and Gene Chaskley welcomed their second child, Genene Lori Chaskley.

Genene was educated in the Winston Salem/Forsyth County School System. She was a 1992 graduate of Mount Tabor High School where she was a member of the flag team. Genene continued her education and graduated from Salem College in 1996 with a degree in English.

A life-long member of Goler Memorial African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, she championed the causes of the Stewardess Board and the Women's Home & Overseas Missionary Society. Additionally, she was the Young Adult Missionary Society Coordinator for the Winston - Salem District. Genene also volunteered in the Youth Department whenever needed.

Genene had a very strong work ethic. Her professional career path led her from Blue Cross Blue Shield of NC, to Aon, and finally to Syngenta as a benefits analyst. Genene truly enjoyed her work and developed lasting friendships with many of her workmates. One of Genene's favorite activities (besides shopping) was running. She joined Black Girls RUN! Winston -Salem in the fall of 2018 and fell in love with the sport. An added benefit was the opportunity to shop for cute running outfits and sneakers. Through her infectious smile, good-natured humor, and ever-positive attitude, Genene gained new "sole sisters".

At the onset of the Corona Virus pandemic in 2020, she endeavored to improve her running. With an unstoppable spirit of determination and fierce independence she worked hard that year, often going out for solo runs. She ultimately reached her goal and significantly improved her running. She completed her first marathon in 2021.

Genene wore many hats and served in so many capacities in the life of her family. She was one of the best conversationalists; the family fun instigator/coordinator; she drove the most fun cars; she was everyone's caretaker; the world's best "Auntie"; the vacation planner; her sister's personal shopper and stylist; a voice of Godly counsel; everyone's cheerleader; and not least of all—a great doggy-mom to Sanchez! Genene didn't back down from a challenge and she lived life on her own terms. She encouraged her family to do the same.
