
#### Our vision at New Hope Baptist Church is:

Philippians 1:3-6 - I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

G.K. Chesterton once said, 'I would maintain that thanksgiving is the highest form of thought; and that gratitude is happiness doubled by wonder." As Christians, we do not appreciate the spirit of gratitude as evidence of the new life found in Christ as we should. Apart from Christ, we are not naturally thankful. We are naturally selfish. In fact, in Romans 1:18-3:22, Paul provides a blistering indictment against humanity, revealing our depravity and showing how we deserve God's eternal wrath, and the sins that we would expect are mentioned, such as sexual immorality and murder. Yet, in Romans 1:21, Paul also mentions something that we may not often think of as sin, humanity "did not give thanks to him." We often think of ingratitude as simply an unattractive quality in a person, but Paul viewed as something much worse. Ingratitude condemns us before the Holy God. It is a form of idolatry that robs God of His deserved praise and glory.

In our sinful flesh, we often assume that everyone, including God, should think the way we think, and everyone should serve our needs. When things do not go our way, we complain, and we accuse. But, as believers, as we grow in Christ, expressing gratitude to God becomes a way of life. This is why Paul instructed believers to "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1Thess. 5:18). Thankfulness is an expression of worship, acknowledging that you are not entitled to God's blessings, but still are benefited by the goodness and graciousness of God, realizing that He is our continuous praise and devotion.

One of God's greatest gifts is the church, the community of God's people. As we enter November, the month of Thanksgiving, let us express gratitude to God for New Hope. I pray that we will become deeply thankful for New Hope as Paul is for the Philippians. I pray that we will consider the community of God's people here at New Hope as the manifold, abundant, all-sufficient grace of our God, who deserves our praise.
