1 Timothy 4:7-10 "Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance. For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe."

The new year provides a good opportunity to examine one's life. If you were to carefully reflect on your daily activities and habits, what you think and worry about the most, what brings you greatest joy, what easily frustrates and angers you, how you spend your time and resources, and the topics/issues that consume most of your conversations, what would this time of serious introspection reveal about your deepest values, priorities, and devotions? Would it reveal a life that seeks to honor God above all else? Would it reveal true godliness?

Unfortunately, for many of us, our lives do not reflect what we want to be true. As Christians, we truly want "to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col. 1:10). If not, we have every reason to question whether we are truly Christian, at least from a scriptural understanding of being a Christian. Yet, even so, it often feels like we are failing to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord. Indeed, there may areas of our lives that betray the kind of person we want to be, especially with our ongoing struggles with specific stubborn sin.

In this new year, we should first recognize and be grateful that our standing before God is not based on our ability to walk in a manner worthy of Him. In our power, we cannot do so. We always fall short. Our standing before God is secured in Christ alone, in His righteousness.

But still, in Christ, we have new spiritual life. We have been born again. Thus, in this new year, we should also examine our lives based on what God's Word teaches us. We should confess our sins, and then, by God's grace and empowerment, we should live in obedience for His glory. Or to put it in the words of the Apostle Paul, written above, we are to "train for godliness."

Where do you need to grow spiritually? What areas of the Christian life do you need to give greater focus and discipline? What about reading God's Word? What about praying without ceasing? What about being active in the community of believer, the church? What about being a witness of Jesus Christ to a dark and lost world?

Concerning 1 Timothy 4:7, pastor David Mathis writes, "Take regular action to get more of God in your mind and your heart, and echo his ways in your life-which will make you increasing like Him ("godliness"). It's a gift, and we receive it as we become it."
