Philippians 1:21 "For to me to live is Christ and to die is gain."

In the opening chapter of Philippians, the Apostle Paul shares an update about his circumstances while imprisoned by the Romans. Paul is uncertain about what will happen to him. His desire is to continue in ministry for the progress of the Body of Christ and he is confident that eventually he would be released. However, his release is not guaranteed, and he knows that things could become worse, leading to his death.

Yet, whether the best outcome occurs, and he is released, or the worse outcome occurs, and he is sentenced to death, Paul remains hopeful. He remains joyful even as he had every reason to despair. Because Paul's identity is in Christ alone, regardless of what happened to him, it would be a win-win outcome. To live is Christ and to die is gain.

This is an empowering perspective on life, and no one can have this confidence in the face of a fallen world, full of threats, except for the true child of God through faith in Jesus. When you set your eyes on Jesus and seek his glory above all else, no matter what happens, you will be just fine. Truly, to live is Christ and to die is gain.

Recently, there was a remarkable testimony of this truth. On Thursday May 18th, news came out that Timothy Keller, an influential pastor, author, and theologian, was discharged from the hospital to receive hospice care at home. His son shared that he prayed with his family, "I'm thankful for all the people who've prayed for me over the years. I'm thankful for my family, that loves me. I'm thankful for the time God has given me, but I'm ready to see Jesus. I can't wait to see Jesus. Send me home."

As it turns out, his time in hospice care was short. The next day, Friday May 19th, Keller breathed his last breath. Among his last words were, "There is no downside for me leaving, not in the slightest." Keller lived with a Philippians 1:21 perspective. May God help us to live with this perspective as well.
