"The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God"

Romans 8:16

Recently, on Wednesday night, we considered how the central work of the Holy Spirit is to make known to us the personal presence of Jesus, our Savior. The gracious work of the Holy Spirit in our lives involves opening our eyes to the beauty of Jesus, enabling to truly appreciate Him and to benefit from the blessings He provides.

One of the ways the Spirit does this is by providing the believer certainly of being a member of God's family, indeed, a child of God. As Paul writes in Romans 8:16, the Holy Spirit bears witness in our spirits that we are children of God. Making a similar point, Paul writes in Galatians 4:6-7, "Because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God."

Clearly, this precious work of the Holy Spirit is very important. As Christians, we do not have to live with constant doubts and fears concerning our standing before God, our Creator. The Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, if indeed, we have truly trusted in the Lord Jesus for salvation, provides constant reassurance of our place in God's family.

When we first believe in Jesus, God does not leave us on our own to figure things out and, for us, to prove ourselves worthy of God's favorable attention, or to develop our own confidence before Him, which would all be in opposition to His grace. Rather, God graciously gives us the Holy Spirit and from inside our hearts, the Holy Spirit cries out, "Abba Father." It is his wonderful work and loving service to us to let us know that God is our Father and Jesus is our Savior.

Concerning this ministry, J.I. Packer writes "The Spirit-given certainty of being loved, redeemed, and adopted through Christ into the Father's family, so as to be 'heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ' (Rom. 8:17), makes gratitude, delight, hope, and confidence- in a word, assurance- blossom in believer's heart." We ought to be very grateful for this glorious ministry of the Holy Spirit.
