Sometime in the 1950s, Audry Mieir was sitting in a Christmas service at her church when she was suddenly inspired to write a hymn. She retells the story, "As the morning service began, I was almost overwhelmed with the fragrance, the sounds, and most of all, with the gentle moving of the Spirit in that church. The pastor stood to his feet, opened the Bible, and said, 'His name shall be called Wonderful.' I tell you the truth, that's all it took, I wrote the words and music in the flyleaf of my Bible. In the Sunday evening service, I taught the chorus to a group of young people, and it was sung for the first time."

The hymn she wrote is one New Hope is very familiar with. It is one we sing frequently, often at the beginning of our services. The hymn goes...

"His Name is wonderful, His name is wonderful, His Name is wonderful, Jesus My Lord. He is the Mighty King; Master of Everything; His Name is wonderful; Jesus My Lord. He's the great Shepherd, the Rock of all Ages; Almighty God is He. Bow down before Him; Love and adore Him. His Name is wonderful; Jesus My Lord."

In a dark and confusing world, with many frustrations, disappointments, and reasons for despair, it is refreshing when the truth of the person and work of Jesus Christ is communicated with few words, yet with precision and conviction. Sometimes, all we can say, and all we should say, is "Jesus."

Christmas is the celebration of the to the most valuable, most beautiful, and most wonderful gift that we have ever received, or could receive, the Lord Jesus, the glorious Son of God, our precious and loving Savior. This Christmas, let New Hope celebrate declaring and testifying the name of Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

18 months have flown by since the Lord gained a wonderful man in His kingdom and Mr. Alzheimer lost the battle with Gene. I shared with you over the months of the experiences that Gene (as the patient) endured and me (as the caregiver) experienced. I pray that you received valuable info from this.

Being 18 months later, heaven seems so much more real because my partner for life is there. It is so much more different than even losing my father to multiple myeloma. As my mother shared with me "you don't understand, because you still have your husband'. And she was so right. The day that Gene left our home for the final time and all of our friends and family had gone home - I found these things out. I had no one to talk to. I had no one to watch T.V. with. I ate all alone. I had no one to hold hands with. I had no one that had my back like Gene did. It was and is very frightening. I find myself going along during the day and all of a sudden, tears are flooding. BUT, this is what has happened. The Lord has helped to fill this huge void in my life with you and my family. Your kind words of encouragement. You're listening to me ramble time and time again. I know it is tiring but the Lord has shown me through you how to minister to others in this same area. I love my church (you), my family and I praise the Lord for you each day. As this is the final writing of our experiences with Mr. Alzheimer, may I say to you that I love you all and thank you all for who you are.
